LinkNYC is a new communications network that is replacing New York City pay phones with state-ofthe-art kiosks called Links.

Each Link is equipped with free services like highspeed Wi-Fi, phone calls, a tablet for maps and city services, and device charging for anyone living in or visiting New York City to enjoy. In addition to Link's features being free to the public, they also come at no cost to taxpayers.

Over the next several years, over 7,500 Links will be installed across the five boroughs. Links provide high-speed Wi-Fi, phone calls to anywhere in the U.S., device charging, a touchscreen tablet for access to city services, maps and directions, and a 911 Emergency Call button. All of these services are free to use and links also have two have two 55" high-definition digital screens used for public service announcements and advertising.

The launch of LinkNYC began with a beta phase, giving New Yorkers an early opportunity to try out Link's features, providing feedback and helping the project's team for creating the future of their sidewalk experience.

Additional apps and services, were and will be rolled out over the next few months and on an ongoing basis over the next decade of the project.
